MY3 allows you to define your network and your plan to stay safe. It helps you prepare to help yourself and reach out to others when you are having thoughts of suicide.



Tips to Help Find a Local Therapist or Counselor

Health Insurance:

Call your insurance provider or visit their website for a list of mental health providers who accept your insurance. Your employee benefit plan (EAP) may also have a list of local providers. Check your coverage carefully by asking the following questions:

- Does my health insurance plan include mental health benefits?
- What is my deductible and has it been met yet?
- How many sessions per year does my health insurance cover?
- Do I need prior authorization from my primary care provider to have these services covered?

Virtual Care:

It is OK to request to be put on a waitlist or to ask for a consultation with a provider to help determine if they're the right provider for you.
