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

# CA patient's story

In February 2017, Letty Hoffman found her life at a stopping point.

A serious reaction to medication had caused complete kidney failure, forcing the then 20-year-old Helena native to start dialysis--an exhausting, painful, time-intensive and expensive set of ongoing treatments.

St. Peter's Health nephrologist Dr. Robert LaClair and the "amazing" team in the Dialysis Unit helped set Letty up with home dialysis. Still, the daily treatments meant plans for getting a job or going to college were on hold. Many of the outdoor activities Letty grew up loving were now off limits.

Worst of all was the toll Letty felt it took on her family.

"It was incredibly hard on my family," she said. "It impacts everyone. When I realized [dialysis] was going to be long term, I had to find a transplant center."

It was an incredible weight off our shoulders.
I almost can't put it into words. The Foundation simply changes lives.

But the high costs that come with transplants made Letty question whether it was a viable option. That's when Wendy Cook, a former social worker for the Dialysis Unit, suggested contacting St. Peter's Health Foundation.

Through help from the Foundation's Patient Assistance Program, Letty was able to travel to Salt Lake City for a transplant. In August 2018, she received two kidneys from a donor.

"It was an incredible weight off our shoulders," Letty said. "I almost can't put it into words. [The Foundation] simply changes lives. I probably couldn't have gone to Salt Lake if I didn't know you guys could help."

The successful transplant has allowed Letty to return to doing what she loves and to planning for her future.

She recently graduated with a certificate in phlebotomy from Helena College and is considering a career in nursing.

"I just really want to help people in the same situation," she said. "I want to spend my life trying to give back after all that people gave to me."





The Emergency Department at St. Peter's Health Regional Medical Center provides quality, experienced care when you need it most—around the clock, 365 days-a-year. Thousands of patients depend on us each year to provide quality medical evaluation and treatment for illness and injury ranging from minor to critical. In 2018, St. Peter's expanded ambulance services by hiring more paramedics and emergency medical technicians and purchasing three new ambulances.


#### ST. PETER'S MEDICAL GROUP

#### BEHAVIORAL HEALTH UNIT

St. Peter's Health Behavioral Health Unit offers a team of professionals if you or a loved one is suffering from a mental health illness. With the only inpatient geriatric psychiatry unit in the state of Montana, we provide a secure unit for adult and geriatric patients who are experiencing psychiatric symptoms that require 24-hour acute inpatient treatment. Our staff focuses on accurately diagnosing the illness, prescribing the right medications, and providing patients and caregivers with education and coping skills.

#### CANCER TREATMENT CENTER

St. Peter's Health Cancer Treatment Center combines state-of-the-art technology with a holistic, patient-centered approach to cancer care. Our patient satisfaction scores consistently rank in the top 5% of cancer centers throughout

the entire Northwest region of the United States. Our oncologists, nurses and therapists provide specialized cancer care, while other

St. Peter's Health can treat 90% of cancers right here in Helena.

#### SURGICAL SERVICES

St. Peter's Health employs general surgeons as well as a growing team of specialists in orthopaedic, colorectal, plastic and reconstructive surgery. Our board-certified surgeons deal with a broad spectrum of illness and injury

by combining an indepth understanding of diagnostic and treatment strategies, perioperative (before, during and after operation) care, and the latest advances in surgical techniques to achieve safe and successful surgical outcomes. We offer minimally-invasive surgical procedures that allow patients to recover more quickly and return to normal activity. In 2018, Dr. Kerry Hale became the first orthopaedic surgeon in Helena to offer anterior

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#### WOMEN AND CHILDREN'S UNIT

St. Peter's Health Women and Children's nursing staff work closely with Helena's obstetricians, certified nurse midwives, family medicine physicians, pediatricians and other specialists to provide safe, quality care to Helena's youngest community members. The first major hospital in Montana to earn the Baby-Friendly designation, St. Peter's offers a preferred birthing experience with an emphasis on

education and support that starts during pregnancy and continues after leaving the hospital. Private rooms have been thoughtfully designed for all stages of labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum care, as well as to encourage "rooming in" of newborns to promote mother/baby bonding. In addition to our Labor and Delivery staff that includes infant nutrition nurses, a Pediatrics staff specializes in providing inpatient care for a variety of acute illnesses for children up to the age of 18.

#### **URGENT CARE**

St. Peter's Health Urgent Care clinics are walk—in medical facilities for the treatment of non—life threatening injuries and illness. An appointment is never required, and staff is committed to providing prompt and comprehensive medical services.

To best serve our community, St. Peter's Health Urgent Care is now open 16 hours a day between our two locations.

#### DIALYSIS CENTER

St. Peter's Health Dialysis Center is nationally recognized for its innovative approach to

improving the quality of life for dialysis patients using in-home hemodialysis therapy. 53 percent of St. Peter's dialysis patients are on home dialysis, which is nearly five times the national average. Dialyzing at home can significantly improve the quality of life. St. Peter's dialysis team

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helps patients with both end-stage and acute kidney failure use hemodialysis, home hemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis and other procedures.



### SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY

As a community-based health care provider, we're focused on improving the health of our community by providing exceptional and compassionate health care services, regardless of an individual's ability to pay. In 2018, we gave back over 40 million to the community through education, health services, donations and free and reduced-cost health care to ensure that finances do not prevent patients from seeking or receiving care.

#### CHARITY CARE


Charity care consists of health care services provided to low-income patients at free or reduced prices, and is provided to those who have exhausted third-party resources, do not qualify for

Medicaid or have insufficient incomes. Ability to pay is based on Federal Poverty Income Guidelines, which take into account family size, assets and overall financial position. St. Peter's Health works diligently to ensure charity care is granted to all patients who qualify.

#### UNPAID COST OF MEDICAID

Medicaid is a jointly funded, Federal-State health insurance program for low-income individuals. Medicaid reimburses health care providers well below the actual cost of care, so the unpaid cost of Medicaid represents the difference between our cost to provide services and the amount Medicaid pays us for those services.

#### KEEPING OUR YOUTH SAFE

In 2018, St. Peter's Health partnered with Small Fry Football and purchased over 400 Guardian Caps for local youth players. The Guardian Caps help keep our youth safe by reducing the likelihood of concussions and traumatic brain injuries.



### IMPROVING COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH

Four out of every five Americans who die by suicide are men, and 15 men took their own lives in Lewis and Clark County in 2017. St. Peter's Health is a proud sponsor of Man Therapy, an innovative program spearheaded by the Lewis and Clark County Suicide Prevention Coalition that uses humor to cut through stigma and tackle tough issues like depression, divorce and suicidal thoughts.



### THERE WHEN YOU NEED US

St. Peter's Health paramedics and EMTs attend dozens of community events, like the Lewis and Clark County Fair, Special Olympics, NAMI Walk and Governor's Cup, and stand ready to respond and care for community members in the event of an emergency.

#### SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES

The Helena region has a great need for several health care services that do not generate sufficient revenue in a community this size to cover the cost of providing them. In 2018, St. Peter's Health subsidized the following services to ensure their availability in our community:

- Urgent Care
- Hospice
- · Home Health
- Hospital-based Pharmacy (the only pharmacy in the community open 24/7)
- · Home Oxygen & Sleep Supplies

- · Behavioral Health

#### COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND SUPPORT

St. Peter's Health provides health-related education to the community through large events, classes and lectures, along with wellness screenings for employees, volunteers and through partnerships with local employers. Education topics include mental health, first aid, CPR, childbirth, breastfeeding, diet and fitness. Most are completely free-of-charge to the community.

#### CASH AND IN-KIND DONATIONS

St. Peter's Health supports organizations and initiatives that share our goal to improve the health and wellbeing of our community. In 2018, that included cash donations to organizations focused on the health, social, cultural and educational needs of our region. In addition, St. Peter's staff donates time, materials and leadership to more than 30 community partners, including Helena Food Share, Florence Crittenton, Helena Family YMCA, Girls Thrive, Helena Public Schools and others.

In 2018. St. Peter's Hospital became St. Peter's Health, but a new name and logo is just the beginning. We marked 2018 with several projects and initiatives to drive continuous process improvement, encourage collaboration with key stakeholders and deliver high value health care to our community.



### NEW AND EXPANDED ENDOSCOPY SUITE

St. Peter's opened a new Endoscopy Suite with four dedicated procedure rooms and ten admit and recovery bays. The expansion enables St. Peter's to perform 2,000 more life-saving colonoscopy screenings per year.

The community contributed \$79,000 to this project through donations to St. Peter's Health Foundation.

### DNV-GL HEALTHCARE ACCREDITATION

In spring 2018, St. Peter's received DNV-GL Healthcare Accreditation. Taking the health care industry by storm, DNV-GL is a global accreditation partner that requires health systems to achieve and maintain the highest performance in quality management and continuous process improvement. This partnership puts St. Peter's on a path to become one of the first hospitals in Montana to

be ISO 9001 certified.



# EXPANDED AMBULANCE SERVICES

In an emergency, every second matters. To address the growing community need for emergency medical response, St. Peter's expanded its ambulance services by nearly doubling ambulance staff and stationing ambulances with local rural fire departments to decrease response times. As a result, response times have been cut in half in areas across the Helena valley.

### ADDRESSING THE YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS

Since 2010, the number of youth admitted to St. Peter's for a mental health crisis jumped from seven to 147. A new and innovative partnership with Intermountain brings a licensed mental health therapist onto the St. Peter's Health care team to provide counseling to hospitalized youth experiencing behavioral health issues such as suicidal ideation or depression. Robust partnerships like this increase access to mental health care and resources for patients at a critical time in their treatment.



### 3D MAMMOGRAPHY MACHINE

A new 3D mammography machine brings the latest imaging technology to Helena. With 3D mammography, there is a 40 percent increase in the detection of small, invasive cancers: earlier detection of cancer, allowing treatment when cancer is in its most curable stage; and a decrease in additional imaging, which reduces cost, time and anxiety for patients. The St. Peter's Health Foundation contributed \$512,000 to the purchase of this equipment.



# ST. PETER'S HEALTH MEDICAL GROUP — NORTH CLINIC EXPANSION

St. Peter's expanded the North Clinic, adding 4,000 square feet of clinical space to house seven new primary care providers who have joined St. Peter's since 2017.



# AFFILIATION WITH UNIVERSITY OF UTAH HEALTH

In fall 2018, St. Peter's announced an affiliation with University of Utah Health. For patients, this means greater access to specialty and critical care here in Helena. The partnership offers all the benefits of being aligned with one of the nation's top academic medical centers, while maintaining our independence as a not-for-profit, community health system.

### TRANSFORMING ST. PETER'S

#### Vision 2025

St. Peter's Health is on a journey to become the gold standard for health care in Montana by 2025. To realize this vision, St. Peter's is focusing on these key initiatives:

#### ANNUAL PERFORMANCE GOALS

St. Peter's has established performance goals for the organization and individual departments that align with its core values: safety, quality, service, accountability and collaboration. These goals target the greatest opportunities for improvement, create transparency and accountability around performance, and reinforce the importance of a values-based culture.



In 2018, St. Peter's achieved nearly all quality goals, with significant improvements in areas like heart failure 30-day mortality and pneumonia 30-day mortality.

#### OPERATIONS INITIATIVE

With fewer resources and an increasing demand for health care services, St. Peter's must operate as efficiently as possible. By rethinking how care is delivered and implementing industry best practices, St. Peter's can ultimately create more value for its patients.

Since launching this initiative in 2018, St. Peter's has saved almost \$13 million by working smarter. That's \$13 million we can now invest in hiring new caregivers, investing in technology and upgrading equipment.

#### ISO 9001 CERTIFICATION

St. Peter's Health is on a path to receive ISO 9001 certification in 2021, a global standard for exemplary quality management systems. Having processes in place to drive continuous performance improvement leads to higher quality outcomes, employee engagement and patient satisfaction.

By standardizing processes and working more collaboratively across the system, St. Peter's can improve the health of its patients through efforts like the Community-Acquired Pneumonia Initiative, which integrates more patient education and care team follow up.

### ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORD (EHR) OPTIMIZATION

The ultimate goal is to have a universally accessible electronic health record (EHR) to better serve patients and promote more streamlined delivery of care. St. Peter's current technology platforms aren't optimized to the level needed to meet this high standard of care. In the coming years, St. Peter's is making numerous investments in new technology platforms and data analytics to better serve its patients over the next decade.

A multi-disciplinary team has been developed and is currently analyzing different software options to determine the solution that will best serve the organization and its patients.

#### CLINICAL INNOVATION

It's a challenge to provide adequate access to health care across the rural communities that surround Helena. Moreover, advancements in technology like telemedicine are forcing health systems to rethink how they care for patients. This is a prime area of focus, and St. Peter's is actively exploring opportunities to integrate innovative practices and technologies to make health care more accessible, wherever you are.



In November 2018, St. Peter's launched TelelCU, which allows our care team to consult with top specialists at University of Utah Health using a secure audio-visual platform.

### Prioritizing Innovation

St. Peter's Health welcomed Dr. Jon Griffin back to the



organization as the Chief Medical
Innovation Officer. Technology
in health care is advancing at an
exponential rate. Dr. Griffin and
his team are developing a clinical
innovation strategy that will
streamline and expand access to health
care services across our community.

#### MASTER FACILITY PLAN

The Master Facility Plan helps St. Peter's design facilities for the future, to make sure the physical infrastructure is in place to support the community's needs for clinical services and programs in the coming years.





#### KEY ENGAGEMENT INITIATIVES

Effective collaboration with employees, providers and the community is essential to St. Peter's ability to transform the organization. Several key engagement initiatives are being implemented to align experts and efforts with the most significant needs facing our community.



St. Peter's was instrumental in the launch of Healthy Together in 2018, a group of local organizations committed to working collaboratively to improve the health of the Helena community.



#### Turning donations into technology

St. Peter's Health Foundation donated \$512,000 in 2018 for the purchase of a 3D mammography machine. This new machine increases the number of images captured during a mammogram from four to 80, allowing radiologists to better detect cancer that may be hidden by surrounding tissue.

According to Mammography Tech Judy Owens (photographed above), "To be able to provide this technology for patients keeps us at the forefront of delivering top notch care. When people donate to the Foundation, their dollars are turned into life-saving equipment for our community."

#### THE CAMPAIGN FOR ST. PETER'S HEALTH

St. Peter's Health Foundation is currently raising funds for the following projects:

### STATE-OF-THE-ART SURGICAL SUITE & DA VINCI SURGICAL ROBOT®

Imagine an operating room of the future: robots help perform operations with pinpoint precision; soothing green light improves visibility and protects surgeons' eyes; power booms suspended from the ceiling swivel within easy reach, lifting cables off the floor and out of the way; and a touch screen display provides immediate access to vital signs, x-rays and MRIs.

Project Cost: \$9 million

### COMPREHENSIVE PALLIATIVE CARE PROGRAM

People are living longer, even when seriously or chronically ill. A comprehensive palliative care program will address the physical, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual needs of these patients and their families. It will facilitate patient autonomy, provide access to information and offer choices to optimize quality of life by anticipating, preventing and treating suffering.

**Project Cost: \$350,000** 

#### BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Suicide has become an epidemic in the U.S., and our community is not immune. In fact, Montana continues to have one of the highest suicide rates in the nation. While not all mental health cases end in suicide, they do have adverse impacts on the health of our community. Detection, early intervention and suitable treatment options are key to effectively addressing mental health conditions. We


effectively addressing mental health conditions. We know there is a need for enhanced mental health services in our community. Our goal is to raise funds to:

- Support integrated behavioral health efforts to engage community resources and ensure all patients receive mental health screening and appropriate follow up.
- Create a psychiatric stabilization unit where patients can go for evaluation and treatment once medically stabilized in the Emergency Department.
- Construct two safe rooms for pediatric inpatients with mental-health related issues with appropriate accommodations while they're admitted to our hospital.
- Remodel and expand the adult inpatient Behavioral Health Unit.

Goal: \$800,000

# CA donor's story

Chuck Mattes, a longtime philanthropist, has been involved for decades in raising money for and championing causes that support people battling cancer.

In 1985, Chuck jumpstarted a project that helped a young cancer survivor, Jeff Keith, complete a cross-country run to raise money for cancer research. That led to Chuck's involvement in helping Jeff establish a nonprofit organization to help cancer survivors live a healthy lifestyle. He also helped raise millions of dollars to build a new cancer treatment center in his home state of Connecticut.

"I saw firsthand the devastating effects of cancer not only on the patient, but the family," he said. "Names and faces are different, but the situations are all alike. I realized the importance of helping people during their time of greatest need."

The importance of Chuck's work really hit home in March 2017, when Chuck himself was diagnosed with prostate cancer and underwent a rigorous set of radiation treatments. He was fortunate to have an early diagnosis followed by successful treatments —he was in remission by July 2018 – but his experience only reinforced his commitment to giving.

"Whatever people can do helps," Mattes said. "Cancer takes a toll on people physically, emotionally and financially. In many cases it bankrupts a family... any one of us could be in that situation tomorrow."

When Chuck's brother, a Vietnam veteran, received "second to none" care at the St. Peter's Health Behavioral Health Unit, Chuck was inspired to make a gift to the St. Peter's Health Foundation.

"I was so grateful for the care he received," he said. "In just a small way we try to pay it forward. People deserve not a hand out, but a hand up. Taking action will change people's lives."


### BUILDING THE FOUNDATION TO GIVE (June 1, 2017-May 31, 2018)
